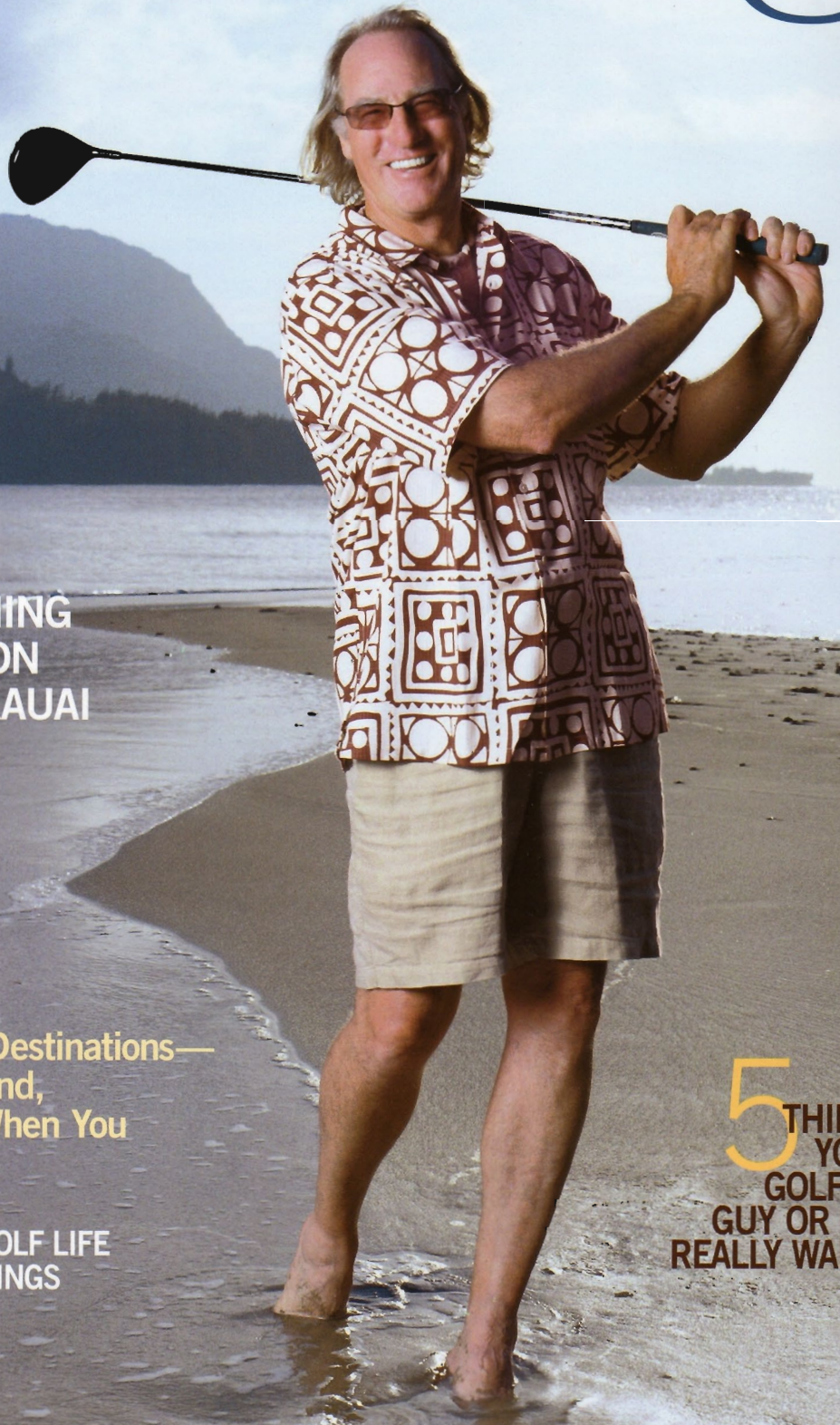

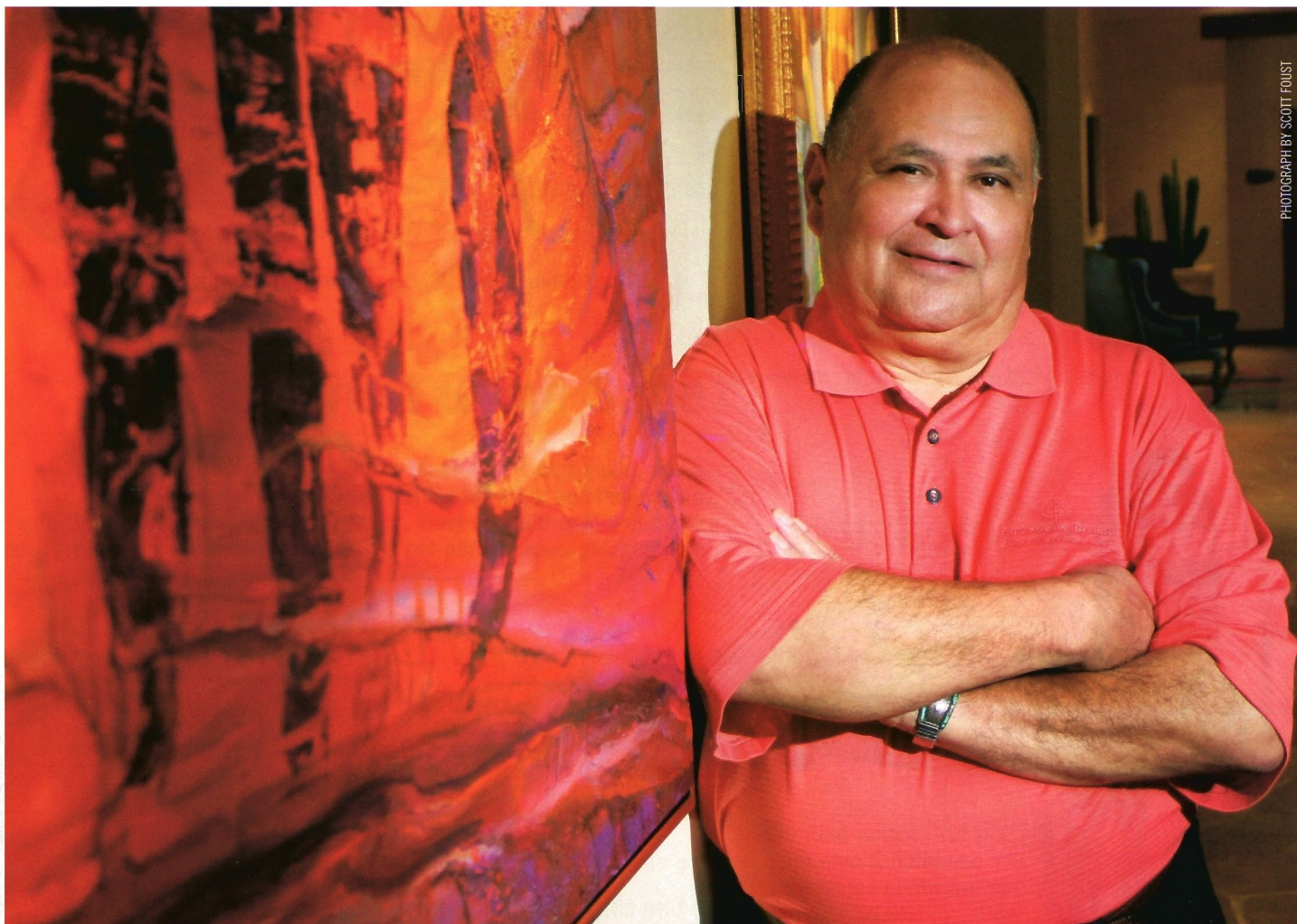

The Hotel As Gallery

Art and elegance meet in the lobby.

Scottsdale has long been acclaimed as both a center for fine Southwestern art and unparalleled luxury accommodations. But the two have never been as closely knit as they now are at the Four Seasons Resort Scottsdale at Troon North.

Here, the art intersects the resort to form The Gallery, an ever-changing collection of artwork spread throughout the Four Season's lobby, hallways and Crescent Moon restaurant. The collection, compiled in partnership with the Scottsdale-based artist organization The Trail of Painted Ponies, includes paintings, sculptures and two lifesize Painted Ponies that are all on display and available for purchase.

Multiple pieces by acclaimed Native American painter Kevin Red Star—whose work also hangs in Phoenix's Heard Museum—are on display, as are canvases from painter Ritch Gaiti, whose "The Cave at Barrier Canyon" (pictured above with artist-in-residence Peter Roybal) is available for \$6,500. Roybal, a silversmith and master bow maker, displays his own handcrafted works at the resort and is available to guide guests on complimentary tours of The Gallery. 480.515.5700, www.fourseasons.com/scottsdale —Jason Kerkmans
